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Conditions of Use

1. Residents in the Ashford Borough Council area entitled to hold a concessionary permit are:

(i) Persons who have attained the age of sixty years.

(ii) Persons blind or partially sighted to the extent that they would be able to register as blind or partially sighted.

(iii) Persons who are profoundly or severely deaf.

(iv) Persons who are without speech.

(v) Persons suffering from any disability or injury which has a substantial and long-term adverse effect on their ability to walk.

(vi) Persons who are without arms or without long-term use of both arms.

(vii) Persons who have a learning difficulty, that is a state of arrested or incomplete development of mind which includes significant impairment of intelligence and social functioning.

(viii) Persons who would if they applied for the grant of a licence to drive a motor vehicle under Part III of the Road Traffic Act 1988, have their application refused pursuant to section 92 of the Act (physical fitness) otherwise than on the ground of persistent misuse of drugs or alcohol.

2. The permit can only be used by the person whose name appears on the front, and it should not be lent or given to anyone else. If it is no longer required, it should be returned to the issuing authority. If the permit should be lost, stolen or misplaced the Council will replace it, but a charge will be made.

3. The holder, when boarding a bus, should show the permit to the driver.

4. All permit holders are subject to the normal Conditions of Carriage and Passenger Regulations as exhibited in the Enquiry and Travel Sales Offices of the appropriate bus undertakings, or published in the official timetables.

5. Ashford Borough Council is not a Transport Authority and cannot guarantee that individual bus services continue or remain unchanged throughout the currency of the permit. If because of any change the permit is felt to be of little further use to the holder then it should be returned to the Council for cancellation.

The authority is under a duty to protect the public funds it administers, and to this end may use the information you have provided on this form for the prevention and detection of fraud. It may also share this information with other bodies responsible for auditing public funds for these purposes.
