What is a Volunteer Tour Guide?

Volunteer Tour Guides open up the park to both existing park users and new audiences. This role is crucial in the current climate to keeping the park accessible to the community whether they are there in person or based at home. For the next six months the role will be filmed and added to a Google Maps interactive activity on the Victoria Park webpages of the ABC website. This will be regularly reviewed and continue until in person tours are safe to commence. We have existing areas we would like tour guides to record about and are also open to areas of personal interest and expertise volunteers may have. Training and support will be given where necessary.
